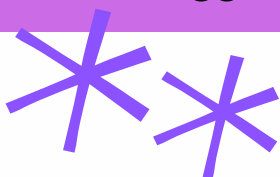


We want to help you become an independent learner with different study skills tools in your toolkit that you can use during your course. It will be important to take notes to develop your independent learning.

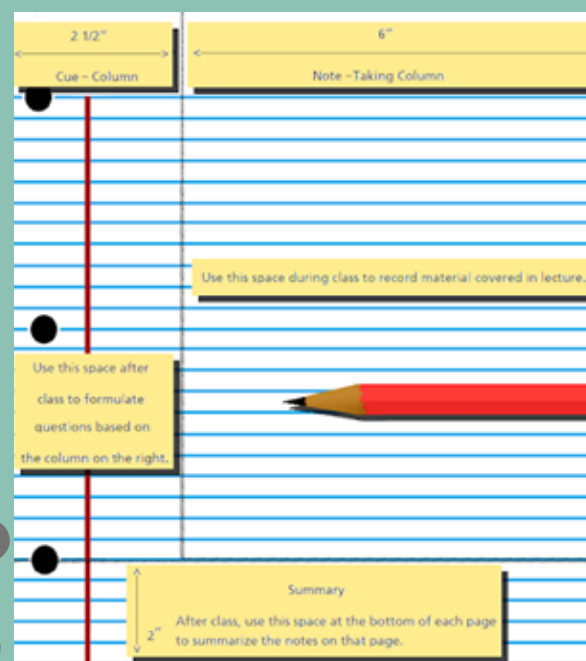


HERE ARE SOME IDEAS YOU CAN TRY FOR EFFECTIVE NOTE TAKING:
