FINDING INFORMATION

There are lots of different places to find information for your course and assessments. This might be books, textbooks, websites, academic journals, magazines or ebooks. Being able to use a variety of resources is a great study skill.

Different Resources

Websites: Websites are a good starting point, yet the information needs to be assessed carefully. In the LRC/ Library we can provide the tools to help you check if the information is valid and accurate. At Level 3 you will need to use a range of resources for assessments, including key resources that your tutors recommend to you.

Books/textbooks: There might be specific books or textbooks for your course that tutors have recommended for you. Can you start reading these over the summer?

Academic journals: Academic journals are a great resource as they are peer reviewed which means they have been checked by other experts in that field and are considered to be a worthy contribution to the area of discussion.
